Jacob Thompson Head Volleyball Coach Leander Rouse HS, 2008 to present



Jacob was born and raised in Texarkana, TX, where he graduated from Redwater High School in 1995. Jacob and his wife Lindsay, also from Texarkana, have been married for 18 years. In 2005, shortly after getting married, Jacob and Lindsey moved to Central Texas, where Lindsay graduated from nursing school. Lindsay now serves as the Clinical Director of Oakwood Surgery Center. They have two sons, Connor (17), who attends Rouse High School, and Bennett (14), who attends Wiley Middle School, and both are thriving in athletics.

Coach Thompson graduated from Henderson State University in December of 2000 and took the head volleyball job at Liberty Eylau from 2001-2005. Thompson turned the program around and guided the team to three playoff appearances in his four years as head coach. In 2005-2008, Thompson became the head coach at Georgetown High School, again making playoff appearances two out of three years. In 2008, he was hired by Leander ISD as the Assistant Coordinator and Head Volleyball Coach at Rouse High School for its inaugural year, opening as a freshman-only campus. Just completing its 16th year since opening, Thompson's teams have been to 10 consecutive playoff appearances, won eight consecutive District Championships, and made five appearances to the Regional Tournament, where his teams have reached the finals three times and one regional championship. In 2017, his Lady Raiders played in the State Tournament and were the 5A State Runner-Up.

In Thompson's 23 years of coaching, he has an impressive 624 wins, has made 15 playoff appearances, and has sent countless players to compete collegiately and professionally.

NIL: Letter from Athlete



Good afternoon,

My name is Samantha Humphries and I am a senior at Flower Mound High School. I run cross country and track for FMHS and I have signed my letter of intent to run at the University of Oregon. My twin sister, Nicole, and I have helped Flower Mound win four consecutive state championships for cross country, and we are both individual state champions as well. I only mention these accolades to set the stage for our situation.

We all know that NIL is becoming a more prominent topic in athletics since the NCAA has given college athletes the green light to profit from their name, image, and likeness. Such a breakthrough has made its way into the high school athletics scene as well. Texas however is one of few states to be behind in its ruling on the subject. Unlike the majority of the country, Texas law does not allow sort of NIL deals for high schoolers.

It is understandable that allowing UIL high school athletes to receive compensation or branding for talents has some ethical consequences. But the truth of the matter is that the rest of the country decided to move forward, yet Texas has not. If this is in attempt to protect the integrity of high school sports and athletes, then its elite athletes are being held back instead. Some are beginning to find loopholes by moving out of the state or graduating early in order to capitalize on opportunities they earned and deserve. As for my situation, my sister and I are being denied brand opportunities that athletes of our caliber are being offered. We easily meet the standards of these other athletes, yet where we live is the governing factor. Is that fair? This proves that the law is outdated, unproductive, and needs to be changed.

NIL recently has been taking over headlines in the high school track and field scene. It is of my opinion that such deals provide no competitive advantage to these athletes but instead allow them to be recognized for their talents and performances. It has been extremely frustrating to see other athletes be celebrated while I am not allowed to be. It is of my knowledge that the Texas High School Coaches Association refused to endorse a bill to change the sad state of the matter. However, that was over a year ago and I feel that since then, the times have changed. Again because the majority of states have decided to move forward with high school NIL, leaving Texas high school athletes to be left out.

Although I am graduating soon, I would like to ask for help on how to make a change. And if nothing is able to be done for myself in the time I have left, then at the very least I would love to be the voice for the younger generations. Please let me know what can be done.

Prep Super League still putting first season together

Last June, <u>I wrote</u> about football entrepreneur Brian Woods' idea to build the Prep Super League, an organization for high school football players to boost their NIL value and scholarship prospects outside the purview of state athletic associations. He targeted an April 2024 launch, and we hadn't heard much lately, so I wanted to see where things stood.

Woods says he expects 400 players to participate this year (his original vision, <u>a plan of 12 50-player teams</u>, called for 600). Also, he may put some markets on the back burner, with hopes of bringing them along next season. But in 2024, he said: "By no means will we be less than 8-10 teams."

Also, he's swapped Phoenix for Las Vegas on the list of markets (Denver replaced Cleveland when PSL sold a franchise to Colorado's Upswing Foundation.) The season will run five weeks instead of six, starting April 27 instead of April 20. Woods is still working on the schedule. They'll run in a centralized hub system, with all games being in either Atlanta, Dallas, Houston, L.A. or Las Vegas.

Strategically, a key issue for the PSL is when states will permit high school students to do NIL deals -- without that legislation, participants in those states would have to choose between high school eligibility and the PSL. Most states do, but Texas and Florida do not. Woods expects Florida NIL legislation to come this spring, but Texas has an unclear path. "We can't have a national high school league without Texas, just because of the immense talent that comes out of that state," he said, but he notes recruitment has still been reasonably good there. Woods is putting stock in a proposed creation of a June signing period for college prospects, which he thinks could lead high school juniors to use the PSL as their "senior season."

<u>AFCA Executive Director</u> *Craig Bohl*

Craig Bohl





Bohl takes over the AFCA after a 43-year career in coaching, including both assistant and head coaching jobs at the Football Bowl Subdivision and Football Championship Subdivision levels. He retired from coaching at the conclusion of the 2023 season with one final victory for the Wyoming Cowboys in the Barstool Sports Arizona Bowl.

Originally from Lincoln, Nebraska, Bohl was a defensive back for the Cornhuskers from 1977 to 1979 and started his coaching

career as a graduate assistant with Nebraska in 1981. In 1984, Bohl made his first stop at North Dakota State as the defensive backs coach. After just one season in Fargo, Bohl moved on to Tulsa as linebackers coach from 1985 to 1986. He spent two seasons at Wisconsin as linebackers coach before becoming the defensive coordinator at Rice in 1989. After five seasons with the Owls, Bohl was the defensive coordinator at Duke in 1994 before returning to his alma mater in 1995.

Bohl would coach at Nebraska for eight seasons, with the first five as linebackers coach. He was a part of two national championship seasons in 1995 and 1997. Bohl was promoted to defensive coordinator from 2000 to 2002 as the Huskers earned a BCS National Championship game appearance in 2001. Following his impressive coaching stint at Nebraska, Bohl returned to North Dakota State, this time as their head coach, in 2003.

At North Dakota State, Bohl guided the program as they transitioned from Division II to Division I-FCS and turned the Bison program into a juggernaut. In his 11 seasons as head coach, Bohl led the Bison to a Great West Conference title in 2006 and three straight Missouri Valley Football Conference titles from 2011-13. NDSU also won three straight FCS national titles, finishing with records of 14-1 in 2011, 14-1 in 2012 and 15-0 in 2013. The Bison became only the second team in FCS history to win three straight national championships. In his 11 seasons with NDSU, Bohl had an overall record of 104-32 and won two AFCA Regional Coach of the Year honors in 2011 and 2013, and two straight AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year honors in 2012 and 2013. Following his third national championship, Bohl became the head coach at Wyoming.

Bohl was the head coach for the Cowboys for 10 seasons and recorded more bowl game appearances (six) and bowl game wins (4) than any other head coach in Wyoming history. He had six winning seasons, which is the second most in program history. In 2016, Wyoming went 8-6 and tied for first place in the Mountain Division of the Mountain West Conference, which led to their first bowl game appearance under Bohl. He followed that up with a second-place finish in the Mountain Division and a win in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. In his final three seasons as head coach, Wyoming won at least seven games each season and appeared in three straight bowl games, winning two of them.

Bylaws of the Texas High School Coaches Association, Inc.

ARTICLE II BOARD OF DIRECTORS

<u>Section 1</u> - The Board of Directors shall consist of the President, President-Elect, Immediate Past President and twenty-seven (27) Regional Directors plus non-voting members consisting of Executive Director, Assistant Executive Director, and Chief Operating Officers. The regions shall be the same as marked on the Coaches Association's map of 1949. The Board of Directors at no time shall exceed thirty (32) members. (12/15)

<u>Section 2</u> – (12/17/76) (3/4/19) – The election of the 24 Regional Directors, three from each region and one Director-Elect and two Alternates, shall take place at the Regional Meeting held during coaching school each year and before the annual meeting of the membership. (07/28/02) (3/4/19) The term of the Regional Director shall be for three (3) years. Every position will move forward every year. The progression will be from second alternate to first alternate to Director-Elect to Freshman Director (provided all live within the region they were elected). The progression for three-year Directors will be Freshman Director, 2nd Year Director, Senior Director. A new Second Alternate will be elected every year.

(3/4/19) Director-Elect, First and Second Alternate: If one or more in this category become ineligible to serve, then every position will move forward and the second alternate (and any subsequent) spot will remain vacant until a new member is elected at the Regional Meeting at coaching school. If any coach in this category moves out of the region in which they were elected, they will become ineligible to serve.

Directors:

- a. <u>Tenure</u> (7/29/72) A Board of Director's tenure starts or ends with the Old and New Directors Meeting at the close of coaching school. (12/17/76) Once a Board of Director has served their full term, they cannot be re-elected to serve as a Director.
- b. Failure of a region to elect a Board of Director at the proper time shall leave that region without representation for one year (until the next election).
- c. Should a Board of Director member elected from one region move to a school in another region, they shall continue in office until their term expires.
- d. (3/4/19) Should a member of the Board of Directors other than the President, President Elect or Immediate Past President, leave the coaching profession or resign from the board their slot will be filled in the following manner:
 - **Freshman Director vacancy** This slot remains vacant with the subsequent Director-Elects subbing for the vacancy for one year, then beginning their terms as Freshman Directors for all three years. The 1st alternate will sub for the Director-Elect at Coaching School.
 - **2**nd **Year Director vacancy** This slot remains vacant with the subsequent Director-Elects subbing for the vacancy for one year, then beginning their terms as Freshman Directors. The 1st alternate will sub for the Director-Elect at Coaching School.
 - **Senior Director** This slot will remain vacant with the Director-Elect subbing for the remainder of the year, then move to his Freshman Director slot the following year. The 2nd Year Director will be appointed Interim Senior Director for the remainder of the vacated Senior Director's term.

The key points to remember are:

- 1. Members need to stay in the order in which they were elected;
- 2. A new 2nd Alternate will be elected every year;
- 3. Follow the progression, not the person who vacated the board;
- 4. If one person leaves the Board of Directors, the Director-Elect is assured 3+ years;
- 5. If two people leave the Board of Directors, the Director-Elect will get 2+ years;
- 6. If three people leave the Board of Directors, the Director-Elect will get 1+ year and the 1st Alternate will get 2+ years.
- e. **President-Elect** Election of the President-Elect shall be by the members of the Association at the regular General Meeting. The Immediate Past President and first year Board of Directors each year will

- make up the committee for the selection of President Elect nominees. To fulfill requirements to be elected to the office of President-Elect, a Director cannot become eligible until they have served two years on the THSCA Board of Directors, and their two years is completed at the close of the Old and New Board of Directors meeting.
- f. (3/4/19)By either death or resignation of the President, the Past President shall take over the duties of the President for the unexpired term, then return to serve an additional year as Past President. Their office vacated by this procedure will remain vacant until they retake the position the following year. If the immediate Past President is unable to assume the duties of President, the next eligible Past President will serve out the remainder of the term.
- g. Should the Immediate Past President for any reason become ineligible to serve in that capacity on the Board of Directors, the next eligible Past President shall fill the vacancy.
- <u>Section 2.2</u> At-Large Directors. In addition to the elected regional directors there will be three (3) at-large directors. The Directors At-Large may come from any region and term of office will be three years in accordance with the elected Board of Director members, with no alternates appointed. The progression will be Freshman Director At-Large, 2nd year Director At-Large, to senior Director At-Large. An at-large Director will be announced each year at the Spring Board meeting by the President. The at-large Directors will serve the region in which they reside. It is recommended, but not required, that the at-large Board of Directors come from one of our three most populous regions (3,5,8). (12/15)
- <u>Section 3</u> **Annual Audit.** The Board of Directors shall have complete control and management of the affairs, funds and property of the THSCA. The Finance/Audit Committee shall approve the detailed report given to membership by the Executive Director each February.
- <u>Section 4</u> Regular Meetings. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be without other notice than this Bylaw, immediately after and at the same place as the annual meeting of the members. The Board of Directors may provide, by resolution, the time and place for the holding of additional regular meetings without other notice than such resolution.
- <u>Section 5</u> **Special Meetings**. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or at the request of majority of the Board of Directors. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board of Directors may fix any place as the place for holding any special meeting of the Board of Directors called by them.
- <u>Section 6</u> **Notices**. Notices of any special meeting shall be given at least five (5) days prior thereto by written notice, delivered personally, mailed, or emailed to each Board of Director at their business address.

Any Board of Director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Board of Director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Board of Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objection to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted, nor the purpose, of any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors, need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting.

- <u>Section 7</u> **Quorum**. A majority of the number of Board of Directors fixed by these bylaws shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Action taken by a majority of the Board of Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be the act of the Board of Directors. If, at any meeting of the Board of Directors, there shall be less than a quorum present, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting from time to time until a quorum is obtained, and no further notice thereof need be given other than by announcement at said meeting which shall be so adjourned.
- <u>Section 8</u> Compensation. By resolution of the Board of Directors, the Board of Directors may be paid expenses, if any, of attendance at each meeting of the Board of Directors and may be paid a fixed per diem sum for attendance at such meeting. No other payment shall be made to the Board of Director than provided herein, except, however, that nothing herein shall be construed as preventing any Board of Director from serving the corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation thereof.

<u>Section 9</u> - Presumption of Assent. A Board of Director of the corporation, who is present at the meeting of the Board of Directors at which action on any corporate matter is taken, shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless their dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting, or unless they shall file their written dissent to such action with the person acting as the secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof, or shall forward such dissent by registered mail to the secretary of the corporation within twenty-four (24) hours after the adjournment of the meeting. Such right to dissent shall not apply to a Board of Director who voted in favor of such action.

<u>Section 10</u> - Executive Committee. (7/21) The Board of Directors may, by resolution or resolutions passed by a majority of the whole Board of Directors, designate one or more committees, each committee to consist of two or more of the Board of Directors of the corporation, which to the extent provided in said resolution or resolutions or in these bylaws, shall have and may exercise the powers of the Board of Directors in the management of the business and affairs of the corporation except where action of the entire Board of Directors is required by law, and may have power to authorize the seal of the corporation to be affixed to all papers which may require it. Such committee or committees shall have such name or names as stated in these bylaws or as determined from time to time by appropriate resolution. Such committees shall keep regular minutes of their proceedings and report the same to the Board of Directors when required. If a replacement were needed for the Executive Director, the Executive Committee of the Texas High School Coaches Association would present a ranked list of nominees to the Board of Directors for approval. If a replacement were needed for the Assistant Executive Director, the Executive Director will make a recommendation of their choice to the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

3.1 Procedure for Replacing Executive Director and/or Assistant Executive Director

(7/88) (3/4/19) In replacing Executive Director, the Executive Committee, following the history of the THSCA, to stay inside the Executive Staff of the association and make a recommendation for a replacement or go outside the association and present a ranked list of three or more nominees to the Board of Directors. For Assistant Executive Director, the Executive Director will make a recommendation of their choice to the Board of Directors. In absence of the Executive Staff, the COO of THSCEF and THSCA will become interim acting Executive Staff.

3.2 Procedure of Electing Directors

(7/81) (3/03) The procedure to follow in THSCA regional meetings are: Elect a 2nd Alternate. The Director-Elect automatically moves up to the Directorship, provided they live within the region they were elected, the 1st Alternate automatically moves up to Director-Elect and 2nd Alternate moves to 1st Alternate. (3/72) Only active coaches would be eligible to be elected to the office of Director.

3.3 Office of President

(8/5/65) In order to be eligible for the office of President or President-Elect, a candidate must have served at least two years as a member of the Board of Directors, attending 2/3 of the meetings, and be an active coach (coach and athletic director would be eligible, athletic director only is not eligible) at the time of their selection to be a candidate for these offices. (12/18/85) - If an active coach leaves a position of active coaching and goes into the position of athletic director after being elected to the office, they would only be able to serve out the elected term of office. (3/6/78) - Past-President, regardless of their active or allied status, will be allowed to serve out their term if they are directly associated with athletics.

3.4 Interpretation of Board of Directors Tenure

(8/72) Director's tenure starts or ends with the Old and New Directors' Meeting at the close of coaching school. To fulfill requirements for President-Elect, a director does not become eligible until they have served two years, and these two years are completed at said meeting.

3.5 Substitute's Pay for Directors

(3/4/66) A Director shall be allowed to include substitute pay when their school district states they must pay their substitute to attend Board meetings of the Association. (12/12/80) - If a Director is docked a full day's pay by their school district to attend Board meetings, the Association shall reimburse them.

3.6 Director's Watch and Ring

(3/71) (12/75) (3/09) (3/14) All senior Directors who fill their three-year term of office, and who maintain the required attendance of three-fourths of the meetings, will receive a Director's ring and Director's watch for services rendered. Directors are eligible for only one ring and one watch and will also be presented with a plaque at the Old/New Board of Directors Meeting.

3.6(a) 1/21 Anyone serving as President of the association and completes their year in that position will receive a President's ring and President's pin at the end of their presidential year at the General Meeting at Coaching School. Upon completion of their tenure as Past-President, the past-president will receive a watch and lifetime member card to be presented at the General Meeting at Coaching School and a plaque to be presented at the Old/New Board Meeting.

3.7 Past Director's Watch

(7/31/71) Elected Directors of the THSCA who served on the Board of Directors for a two-year term are (12/18) eligible to receive a Director's watch.

3.8 Spring Board Meeting

(3/4/77) (12/13) The THSCA Spring Board meeting will be held on dates determined by the Executive Director and approved by the Board of Directors.

3.9 New Board Members

(12/11/82) (12/19) The new Board Members orientation and indoctrination will be held at time and location determined by the Executive Director.

3.10 Alternate Director

(3/2/63) Alternates allowed and invited to attend all meetings of the Board of Directors at their own expense.

3.11 President-Elect

(12/9/83) There shall be no campaigning for the office of President-Elect.

The Texas Way Campaign

The Texas Way is a joint campaign between THSCA, THSADA, and 2Words Character Development to (1) improve the level of sportsmanship at Texas UIL sporting events; (2) decrease the number of ejections at Texas UIL sporting events; and (3) improve the relationship between coaches, athletes, officials, and fans.

The Three Pillars of The Texas Way?

We believe that these commitments are the "on ramp" to sportsmanship. By committing to these three pillars, we will be in the best position to interact positively with other people, handle ourselves with character and class, and be in the best position to perform or support at our best.

To coach, play, and support The Texas Way means you commit to the following:

1. Respect For Others

Respect for Others is a commitment to give respect to all participants (coaches, players, officials, and fans) because of who *I am, not because of what they do.*

Respect, The Texas Way, is given generously.

2. Control of Self

Control of Self is a commitment to give boundaries your thoughts, words, and actions, and to control your anger in the face of competition and adversity.

Self Control, The Texas Way, is to handle adversity with class, and keep your anger in check.

3. Spirit of Competition

Spirit of Competition is a commitment to give everything you have to be the absolute best you can be; to work to put your team in the best position to win; and to not sacrifice your character in the process.

Competition, The Texas Way, is about more than a scoreboard.

The Texas Way Game Plan

- 1. ANNOUNCE at the THSADA Summer Convention, June 2-5, 2024
- 2. LAUNCH at Coaching School, July 21-23,2024.
- 3. <u>BLITZ</u> statewide and sports specific media.
- 4. PROMOTE stories throughout the school year.
- 5. MEASURE year over year incidents.
- 6. <u>ADJUST</u> year two based on our learnings and measurements.

<u>LEVEL 1 ASK:</u> Coaches will share The Texas Way Fan video and other fan resources at booster club and parent meetings, and promote The Texas Way in their community.

<u>LEVEL 2 ASK:</u> Integrate The Texas Way Game Day resources into the game day experience. For example: Hanging banners in the stadium; creating a

sportsmanship video, featuring local athletes, using video template provided; or adding The Texas Way uniform patch to jerseys.

District Recognition

Districts can receive The Texas Way Sportsmanship Award by completing the following:

- 1. Coaches and Athletes complete The Texas Way sportsmanship training.
- 2. Coaches share The Texas Way Fan resources with the community.
- 3. The district has the same or fewer ejections/incidents as the 2023-2024 school year.
- 4. Coaches implement an intentional character development program through athletics.
- 5. Complete a student-athlete led community service.
- 6. Host an Officials Appreciation night.
