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





# **Rock Update**

### HOW ROCKS ARE SELECTED IN 2025

There will be 50 new ROCKs joining the ROCK Coaches Mentoring Program in 2025.

- To ensure a diverse ROCK class, each region must have at least 1 females, 1 minority, and 1 non-football coach. A ROCK mentee cannot represent more than 1 group.
- 27 ROCKs are automatic selections. Those that receive automatic selections have been emailed. Automatics are selected by the following:
  - o 3 THSCA Officers
  - 13 Urban ISD Athletic Directors
  - 9 Senior Directors
  - 2 Texas A&M Coaching Academy
- 23 ROCKs are selected from nominations by THSCA members.
  - In mid-December, nominations will be mailed and emailed to members of the Athletic Director Advisory Committee for review. The AD Advisory Committee will then select ROCKs for each region and submit those selections to the THSCA by January 10th.

### PROGRAM UPDATE

Based on surveys of ROCK Mentees from the Class of 2021, 2022, and 2023

- 89.6% Rated 7 or higher (10 pt. scale) that the program influenced their decision to stay in the profession
- 90.4% reported greater confidence in their role due to mentoring
- 88% believed mentoring improved their relationships with players
- 86.8% willing to become mentors themselves in the future
- ROCK program is having an impact on coaches engagement and staying power within the profession
- ROCKs are overwhelmingly seeing the connection between mentoring and how they go about their profession

Areas of focus

- Align curriculum with Ecsell data, effective coaches
- Offering additional training/ support for mentors
- Finding opportunities to support ROCK Alumni

Ecsell supports sports participation and measuring the efficacy of education-based athletics and activities. With over 15,000 student-athlete assessments completed, their data, combined with accountability measures-including attendance rates and GPA, can effectively predict a positive correlation between educational outcomes and effective coaches.

#### Status Update for THSCA-Nov. 12

  - 7,679 student-athlete assessments collected in the Fall

# **THSCEF Good Will Programs**



#### **Permanent Injury Program**

Started in 1938, this program provides indemnity for permanent and total disability caused by injury sustained while participating in any sport sanctioned by the University Interscholastic League, which includes any game, scheduled practice, or off-season athletic class under the supervision of a regularly employed coach who is a member of the THSCA. This program has since been extended to include both Private and Parochial school athletes. Injured athletes who qualify for this program are provided monthly checks for continued financial support. We currently provide aide to 27 injured athletes each month and have provided over **\$835,000** in financial support to injured athletes since its inception.

#### **Memorial Benefit Program**

In 1967, this program was initiated to provide indemnity in the case of a death of a junior high or high school athlete, whose head coach of the sport in which the death occurs, is a member in good standing of the THSCA. The program currently grants \$3,000 for the death of an athlete when said death is caused by participating in any University Interscholastic League sanctioned sport, if an accident occurs in a game, scheduled practice or off-season athletic class, under the supervision of a regularly employed coach. This program has also been extended to both Private and Parochial student athletes. Since inception, this program has provided over \$227,000 in assistance to families of deceased athletes.

#### **Benevolence Fund**

Created in 2005, the Benevolence Fund has allowed the enhancement of aide for both Permanent Injury and Memorial Benefit candidates. The fund permits the association to provide aide in special needs and hardship cases that extend beyond those covered by the current Permanent Injury and Memorial Benefit policies. This fund has afforded the opportunity to provide over **\$820,000** in financial assistance.



## **AFCA Power of Influence Award**





Kendall Miller just finished his 3rd season as Head Football Coach at Frisco Emerson High School after spending the previous 9 years at Lakeview Centennial High School in Garland.

Miller's 25-year coaching career began in Arlington as a math teacher and assistant coach at Sam Houston H.S. After 10 years as an assistant, Miller received his first head coaching position at South Oak Cliff H.S. in Dallas where he spent 3 seasons. After winning two district championships and two "Coach of the Year" honors, Miller accepted the Head Coaching position at Garland Lakeview. During his tenure at Lakeview, Miller won the school's first playoff game and district title in over 20 years. In February 2021, Coach Miller accepted the head coaching position at Emerson High School in Frisco ISD. Last season, Miller became the first coach in Frisco ISD history to lead a school to the playoffs in their inaugural varsity season.

Coach Miller is a Past President for the THSCA. He is the son of Ocell and Annie Miller. Miller's father was a Texas High School coach for 34 years before retiring in 1997. Miller was born in Dallas, Tx and graduated from Skyline H.S. where he was a 3-sport athlete. He played baseball at Tarleton State University.

Miller earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics from Tarleton State. He and his wife Samanda are the parents of two daughters: Sydney (13) and Kara (11).

The committee for a Code of Ethics for the Texas High School Coaches Association formed the Code and presented it to the THSCA Board of Directors. It was then presented to the membership for a vote and was passed by the membership on August 5, 1960 in Dallas. In 2020 it was revised to reflect coaches of all sports and presented to the Board of Directors at the March 2020 THSCA Board meeting for approval.

If you don't have expenses and your items are donated, you may donate that money to the PAC, Benevolence Fund or use as door prizes. Please send all money collected for the Benevolence Fund to THSCA via a cashier's check. PLEASE DO NOT SEND CASH.

- 9. Each Senior Director will receive a check for \$100.00 to be used for expenses incurred for conducting the Regional Meeting. There is no need to send in a financial report to THSCA.
- 10. IMPORTANT: Coaches who lecture at your Regional Meeting should be scheduled LAST in the program.
- 11. Promote the Benevolence Fund! If you have a coach in your region who has been affected by the fund, have them give a testimonial.
